

## DAYCARE Supply List

### **Annual Supplies:**

3 boxes of tissues, 4 Clorox wipes, 2 paper towels, 4 hand soap (no Anti-bacterial), 1 gallon size Ziploc bags, 1 box of XL Ziploc bags (12-24 months only) and 2 boxes of jumbo crayons (12-24 months only)

### **Daily Supplies:**

#### **Infant: Ages 6 weeks to 12 months**

- A supply of preferred diapers and wipes
- 3 complete changes of clothing (labeled and in ziplock bag)
- Prepared bottles (Bottles including the tops must be labeled with your child's name and the date)
- Meals and snacks prepared and ready to feed in a labeled container.

#### **Toddlers 12-24 months**

- A supply of preferred diapers and wipes
- 3 complete changes of clothing (labeled and in a ziplock bag)
- Blanket/Pillow/Mat \*We will not accept individual items. Must be 3 in 1 and rolled together - NO sleeping bags
- Reusable water bottle or drinking cup \*Bottles and cups including the tops must be labeled with your child's name and the date.
- Lunch items: Please use reusable containers your child is able to eat out of and that can easily be stored inside your child's lunch box and fit in their cubby.

#### **Additional Items for Infants & Toddlers**

- Sippy cup for water (if appropriate)
- Diaper cream with a medication form (if appropriate)
- Sunscreen with a medication form (if appropriate)
- Pacifier (if appropriate) and/or any additional items to help your child feel secure & safe \*AL DHR does not allow blankets.
- Bibs and burp clothes \* These items are supplied by the classroom; however, some parents prefer to use their own.

#### **Additional Information:**

In order for BA Infant & Toddler Staff to dispense or keep any medication including diaper cream and sunscreen (prescription and/or over the counter) a medication form is required. The medicine needs to be labeled, dated, and in its original container and will be stored in a locked cabinet. Medication may only be given to director and assistant director. In addition, DHR now requires a prescription for ALL medication including over the counter medicines and diaper creams. The prescription must list the specific medication (off brand must be listed as an alternative), reason for medication and dosage and be signed by a doctor.
